Each year, in the afterglow of Christmas, we are given the opportunity to reflect on the holy family and also our own human family and family life. Pope Leo XIII, promoted the observance of this feast with the hope that it might instill into Christian families something of the faithful love and the devoted attachment that characterize the family of Nazareth. The primary purpose of the Church in instituting and promoting this feast is to present the Holy Family as the model and exemplar of all Christian families.

Kindergarten Registration at Wellington Catholic DSB

The Wellington Catholic District School Board will be accepting new registrations for kindergarten at our schools beginning January 6, 2025!

To be eligible for registering in kindergarten, children;

- must be four years of age on or before December 31, 2025, to attend Year 1 Kindergarten
- must be five years of age on or before December 31, 2025, to attend Year 2 Kindergarten

To register we ask that you visit https://www.wellingtoncdsb.ca/registration/kindergarten_registration and complete the online student pre-registration form. Once you have completed this form you will receive a follow-up email to complete the registration process. We ask that you have the following documents available;

- Child's Birth Certificate
- Parent Or Child's Baptismal Certificate
- Proof of Tax Support for Families New to the System (i.e., Most Recent Tax Bill)
- Proof of Address (Government Document, Mortgage or Rental Agreement, Hydro Bill, Credit Card Statement)
- Immigration Documentation (If Applicable)
- Custody Documents (If Applicable)

During the registration process, school administration are available to assist you with any questions you may have.

Please note:

Students currently attending a Wellington Catholic Year 1 Kindergarten program are **NOT REQUIRED** to register for Year 2 Kindergarten.

JUBILEE 2025

Bishop Crosby will solemnly open the Holy Year at the Cathedral Basilica, on Dec. 29, 2024 at the 11:00 am Mass. A replica of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica will be 11: displayed throughout the Holy Year.

What is a Jubilee? The Jubilee has always been an event of the people. In fact, the first Holy Year of 1300 was born at the request of the People of God. In the Christian era, after the first Jubilee, the recurrence for the jubilee celebration was set by Pope Boniface VIII to be every 100 years. In 1342,

following a petition from the Romans to Pope Clement VI, the period was reduced to 50 years. Subsequently, Pope Paul II, in the mid-15th century, reduced the inter-jubilee period to 25 years.

What is the significance of the Holy Door? The Holy Door is one of the most characteristic signs of the Jubilee. For the coming year only the Holy Doors of Rome will be opened. At Christmas, pope Francis will open the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica. The next day he will open a holy door at a local Roman prison. In the weeks After Christmas, the Holy Father will open the Holy Doors of his Cathedral - St. john Lateran; St. Mary Major; and St. Paul-outsidethe-walls. In crossing the threshold, the pilgrim is reminded of Jesus in John's Gospel - "I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture."
